Conditional sentences type I (If-clauses type I)

3 Before the exam

1. If the alarm doesn't ring, he won't wake up early.
2. If he doesn't wake up early, he will miss the early bus.
3. If he misses the early bus, he will have to take the later bus.
4. If he takes the later bus, he will feel nervous when he arrives at school.
5. If he feels nervous, he won't get a good mark.
6. If he doesn't get a good mark, he won't pass.

Conditional sentences type II (If-clauses type II)

5 Studying abroad

Linda:

1. If I was accepted by a US college, I would get a room in a students' hostel.
2. I would never feel lonely if I lived in a students' hostel.
3. It wouldn't be so expensive if I got a scholarship.
4. If I needed more money, I would look for a part-time job.

Linda's parents:

5. If you studied in the US, we wouldn't be able to visit you often.
6. There would be no one to look after you if you were ill.
7. You would feel lonely if you left all your friends behind.
8. If we didn't have three other children, we would think about letting you study abroad.
